The new logo, with its rising teal element, represents positive, forward movement. Over the next few months, you'll notice the new logo and colors in more places during an intentional, gradual transition. In the meantime, your accounts will continue just as they are. You can still use and reorder your checks. Likewise, your Ent-branded debit and credit cards remain valid, and we'll automatically send replacements when they're close to expiring. If something changes in the future, we'll share that well in advance and guide you along the way.

While the same friendly faces you trust to serve you will start to show off the new logo and colors, our core values will remain the same. We're dedicated to you – our members – and the communities we serve.



## Quick banking tips as we become Wings

While our look is starting to evolve, how you bank with us is just the same. If something changes, we'll let you know ahead of time and guide you along the way.

- **Routing number (307070005)** – remains the same: it may be listed under Wings or Ent
- **Ent checks** – use and reorder as needed
- **Ent credit and debit cards** – use and we'll send new cards close to expiration
- **Ent loans** – current terms and local servicing remain the same
- **Account numbers** – no immediate change: ongoing testing will determine if they stay the same
- **Colorado service centers** – existing locations remain open
- **Minnesota service centers** – full-service banking for Colorado members is slated for 2028/2029
- **Digital banking** – use your usual login: you'll be upgraded this summer

## Stay scam smart!

Scammers are great at trying to catch people off guard. That includes taking advantage of tax season and also when organizations merge or change their name. To stay safe, check out these tips.

### The verify-your-account scam

Be on the lookout for official-looking (and sounding) emails, texts, calls, and social media "from" Ent and Wings claiming you must verify your account due to the merger. These are scams. Don't respond or click on any links. Please report any merger scams, and anything suspicious, to us so we can monitor the situation and inform other members as well.



### What we never ask for

Keep in mind that [Ent](#) and Wings will **NEVER** contact you and ask for your digital banking login, PIN, security code, account number, full Social Security number or other sensitive information.

### Verify it's us

As always, if you get a request for your banking or personal information, please protect yourself by verifying our contact information and reaching out to us directly. Scammers make it all too easy to simply click on a phony link within a message or use a false phone number they provide. Instead:

## We say YES to help Colorado kids

### Grant applications are now open

Young people are the key to keeping our communities successful now and in the future. And why for 26 years, we've offered Youth Endowment Series (YES) grants to nonprofit agencies that provide life-changing services to area youth.

That includes Safe Passage, Colorado's only fully co-located children's advocacy center, which has received YES-grant support for a decade. "They're really investing in the future and believing in what it looks like to really support kids and families in our community," said Emily Bowker, Safe Passage Director of Development Strategy and Partnerships. "That's what they swear they live by as far as their mission – and they play it out. They really do."

This year, a total of \$300,000 will be awarded to Colorado nonprofits. Applications are open now through March 5, 2026, and winners will be announced in May. ## Honoring the extraordinary:

### Ent Community Advocate Award Winners

Since 2022, we've been recognizing Coloradans who demonstrate extraordinary dedication to helping others and creating meaningful change in Colorado communities. We're proud to award our latest advocates a combined total of \$50,000 to continue their vital work.

**Val Macri-Lind (Fort Collins)** – Cofounder and clinical director of ChildSafe Colorado which has provided trauma-informed (childhood abuse) therapy to children, adults and families for 40 years.

**Lauren Herman (Aurora)** – Founder of Levi's Legacy which supports families whose children have congenital heart defects in honor of her son, Levi, who she lost to heart complications: she's raised more than \$500,000 for research and care programs at Children's Hospital Colorado.

**Ty'Anna Jones-Boyd (Colorado Springs)** – Founder of Girl's Breast Friend and co-founder of Beyond October, to help advance culturally-grounded healing and provide survivorship support to women facing cancer in Southeast Colorado Springs.
